"Beef" and "Mutton" are both grammatically correct. Beef has a meaning closer to "meat", and mutton has a meaning closer to "sheep's meat". Mutton comes from the Middle English mut, and means "mutton" ("a sheep"). Beef comes from the Old English beoc, which means "calf". "Calf" refers to the part of the body (belly) of a calf, not "meat" in the sense of beef. Google Groups FAQ Join your peers to discuss Internet and Web issues. Browse the Internet using your computer. Good luck! But really, the title is fine the way it is. Also, to be honest, I don't see that as a problem. You may be lucky enough for someone to edit it for you and change the title, but it's not a requirement. See, we're not that desperate. Most people won't make the effort to correct errors or make changes in titles on their own. Good luck getting a better title for the site. Wait. This site has a subpage that says "This site is not affiliated with in any way" ("This site" being a car manufacturer) That should have been the bottom of the title page. I wonder why it's not there. It's too late to fix now, but it's a good example to show that you need to be careful with what you say in the title page. There is nothing wrong with the title. Sometimes people think that a subpage such as www.mikobusse.com/news/news.html should appear at the bottom of the page, but it should be at the top of the page. The subpage is completely unrelated to the main page. I suggest that you make the subpage as part of the main page, or else, the main page should include a link to the subpage. In short, www.mikobusse.com/news/news.html should appear as a subpage at the top of the page, but it should not appear at the bottom of the page.
